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# Leadership University **Apologetics 202**

Origins and Creation of the Universe, Earth and Humankind.

#### **Mission Statement**

To empower and equip leaders to be sent and positioned for ministry in the inner cities around the world for the cause of the gospel.

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course will address secular theories on the creation and origins of The universe, Earth & humankind. Students will investigate "Biblical" concepts and doctrines on creation as well as the lack of evidence facing Darwinian theories on the origin of existence outside of God. The course will also discuss biblically parallel argument such as: Creationism and Intelligent design.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Upon completion of this course:

- 1. Students will understand what both creationism and Intelligent design are only scientific and possible explanations for existence and origins.
- 2. Students will gather and research biblical concepts and doctrines on creation and origins.
- 3. Students will gain confidence to address secular theories to creation, especially those that claim to be based on science and evidence.
- 4. Students will be able to confront the lack of evidence for origin of existence outside of God, by using concrete evidence and scientific reasoning.
