## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This is a prerequisite course to Leadership University's Leadership Program. This course will better prepare students to step into leadership with confidence that they are following God's calling in their life through a move of the Spirit. The flow of the Spirit releases an EASE that puts an end to the striving and struggling Christian walk and allows us to run and build without growing weary.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Upon completion of this course:

- 1. Students will better understand the supernatural nature of the Godhead, and their relationship to the trinity that gives them access, anointing and authority.
- 2. Students will comprehend their own supernatural nature.
- 3. Students will be more confident of their interaction in the supernatural realm, and ability to recognize the move of the Spirit privately and corporately.

## **REQUIRED TEXTS**

Holy Bible: preferably a word for word or thought for thought translation. (*Textbooks, workbooks, lab fees, etc. are a normal part of the cost of your education.*) Photocopies of the pages will not be accepted for credit. This constitutes a breach of copyright law and drives up the cost of textbooks. You will enter your book assignments into the portal each week for review.

### REQUIREMENTS

## **Portal Access and Usage**

All TWLU classes require students to have digital access to our portal during lecture times and in order to complete all course content and assignments. As well as giving online students the ability to access the live stream lectures (which are in real time and cannot be retrieved at a later time).

#### **Attendance**

You are expected to attend each class. Class attendance ensures your learning the material in its entirety. Only one excused absence will be allowed, with a prior approval by the professor. Unexcused absences are not acceptable and may result in the loss of points and/or the inability to complete assigned work.

#### **Late Work**

Late work will only be accepted under special circumstances and only with **prior approval** from the professor (see guidelines for absences). If late work is allowed, a late penalty of 10% per week will be applied.

#### **Student Conduct**

Leadership University upholds the highest of standards when it comes to development of classwork and assignments. All work should be your own. Plagiarism is unacceptable and will result in an immediate failure of the course.

- 2. Do NOT include direct quotes unless the quote is cited properly and gives the author credit. Describe the material in your own words. Do not use words you do not understand.
- 3. You are free to consult with classmates about assignments, but please ensure that your work is your own. If your work looks too much like your classmates, plagiarism rules may be enforced.

## **Assignments**

Students are required to complete reading assignments on time and be prepared for class discussions and activities. Students are required to complete all assignments on time, complete assigned reading and be prepared for class discussions and activities. All written assignments must be entered into the portal using the Homework link at the bottom of each corresponding lesson. **Grades cannot be given to assignments that are not turned in through the portal.** Grades will be comprised of:

- 1. Homework Assignments submitted through the portal
- 2. Weekly Quizzes closed book, immediately following each lecture
- 3. Final Exam closed book, in class
