COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Textbook

Portal Access and Usage

Students are required to complete reading assignments on time to be prepared for class discussion and activities. Students are also required to complete all assignments on time. All written assignments must be entered into the portal using the homework link at the bottom of each corresponding lesson. **Grades cannot be given to assignments that are not turned in through the portal.** Course grade will be comprised of:

1. Homework Assignments – completed weekly, submitted through the portal
2. Weekly Quizzes – closed book, in class, immediately following each lecture
3. Final Exam – closed book, in class
