Students are required to complete all assignments on time, complete assigned reading and be prepared for class discussions and activities. All written assignments must be entered into the portal using the Homework link at the bottom of each corresponding lesson.

Grades cannot be given to assignments that are not turned in through the portal. Grades will be comprised of:

- 2. Weekly Quizzes closed book, immediately following each lecture
- 3. Midterm take home, open book, open note
- 4. Final Exam in class, closed book, no notes (Bible permitted)
