COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a prerequisite course to Leadership University's Leadership Program. This course will better prepare students to step into leadership with confidence that they are able to safeguard their heart from offense from those they lead and with those in authority over them. This will enable them to support the vision of the house and their pastoral staff in a way that builds the kingdom and brings God glory.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course:

1. Students will learn to identify the demonic traps that hinder right relationships within the body of Christ and with God.
2. Students will receive training on how to maintain healthy relationships in a church home, under church leadership and support the vision of the house.
3. Students will gain tools to escape the trap of revenge and keep their hearts pure.
4. Students will confront their own thoughts concerning offense with the truths explained in this course for stronger personal leadership development.

REQUIRED TEXTS

The Bait of Satan *Living free from the deadly trap of offense*. John Bevere. 20th anniversary edition. Charisma House 2014. (*Textbooks, workbooks, lab fees, etc. are a normal part of the cost of your education.*)

Photocopies of the pages will not be accepted for credit. This constitutes a breach of copyright law and drives up the cost of textbooks. You will enter your book assignments into the portal each week for review.

REQUIREMENTS

Portal Access and Usage

All TWLU classes require students to have digital access to our portal during lecture times and in order to complete all course content and assignments. As well as giving online students the ability to access the live stream lectures (*which are in real time and cannot be retrieved at a later time*).

Attendance

You are expected to attend each class. Class attendance ensures your learning the material in its entirety. Only one excused absence will be allowed, with a prior approval by the professor. Unexcused absences are not acceptable and may result in the loss of points and/or the inability to complete assigned work.

Late Work

Late work will only be accepted under special circumstances and only with **prior approval** from the professor. If late work is allowed, a late penalty of 10% will be applied.

Assignments

Students are required to complete reading assignments on time and be prepared for class discussions and activities. Students are required to complete all assignments on time, complete assigned reading and be prepared for class discussions and activities. All written assignments must be entered into the portal using the Homework link at the bottom of each corresponding lesson. **Grades cannot be given to assignments that are not turned in through the portal.** Grades will be comprised of:

1. Homework Assignments – 5 devotions weekly, uploaded to the portal
2. Weekly Quizzes – closed book, immediately following each lecture
3. Final Exam – closed book, in class

Coursework

Homework: is assigned weekly and can be found on the last page of the course syllabus.

Homework is due one week after assigned and must be submitted before the following class period using the appropriate assignment link in the portal (see Late Work policy).

Quizzes: are mandatory and should be completed during allotted time immediately following the class lecture. Failure to complete it in the appropriate time may result in loss of points.

Quizzes are viewed as “in class” quizzes and have a 10-minute time limit.

Midterms: are a take home assignment that may be done open book. Each midterm must be completed once the test is started (it has a time constraint). Please do not save and try to return it because it must be completed the same day it is opened, otherwise the system will automatically submit it. (Midterms are not required in pre-requisite classes).

Finals: must be done in person and are closed book. Only physical Bibles are permitted in test taking area. Please bring an acceptable device to class to access your account on test taking days and any necessary batteries or cords.
