COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a prerequisite course to Leadership University's Leadership Program. This course will better prepare students to step into leadership with confidence that they are able to safeguard their heart from offense from those they lead and with those in authority over them. This will enable them to support the vision of the house and their pastoral staff in a way that builds the kingdom and brings God glory.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course:

1. Students will learn to identify the demonic traps that hinder right relationships within the body of Christ and with God.
2. Students will receive training on how to maintain healthy relationships in a church home, under church leadership and support the vision of the house.
3. Students will gain tools to escape the trap of revenge and keep their hearts pure.
4. Students will confront their own thoughts concerning offense with the truths explained in this course for stronger personal leadership development.

REQUIRED TEXTS

The Bait of Satan Living Free from the Deadly Trap of Offense. John Bevere. 20th anniversary edition. Charisma House, 2014.

REQUIREMENTS

Portal Access and Usage

All TWLU classes require students to have digital access to the portal to obtain and view video lessons, written notes, quizzes, and homework assignments. All quizzes and homework assignments must be submitted through the portal.

Attendance

As an online student, your attendance is based on your weekly participation. You are expected to complete course assignments on a weekly basis. Weekly class attendance/participation ensures you learn the material in its entirety and that you remain on track with the class throughout the term. If you experience extenuating circumstances that affect your attendance/participation, please contact your TA right away.

Late Work

Late work without penalty will only be accepted under special circumstances and only with prior approval from the TA or Student Success (see Attendance guidelines). The **late work penalty** is 10% per week. Homework assigned prior to midterms will not be accepted after the midterm exam due date. Absolutely no homework will be accepted after the last day of class.

Coursework

1. Homework: is assigned weekly and can be found on the last page of the course syllabus. Homework is due one week after assigned and must be submitted before the following class period using the appropriate assignment link in the portal (*see Late Work policy*).
2. Quizzes: are mandatory and should be completed right after watching the video. Failure to complete quizzes will result in a loss of points.
3. Final: must be done **in person** and is closed book. Only physical Bibles are permitted in the test taking area. Please bring an acceptable device to class to access the portal on test taking days along with any necessary cords or charger. Online students are required to show up in person to take finals. 4835 Hallmark Pkwy, San Bernardino, CA 92407. *Remote learners (outside a 50-mile radius from The Way World Outreach Hallmark Campus) can test remotely but must have one camera facing the student and one camera facing their computer screen to ensure integral proctoring of the test.*

Assignments

Each week, students are to complete the assigned reading, watch the video lesson, take the quiz, and complete the assigned homework within one week. If the homework is submitted after the one week period, points will be deducted. All assignments must be submitted into the portal using the Homework Link at the bottom of each corresponding lesson. **Scores cannot be issued for assignments that are not turned in through the portal.** Course content for online classes will be available on Monday of each week and is due the following Sunday by 11:59PM.

PLAGERAIISM AND STUDENT CONDUCT

Leadership University upholds the highest standards when it comes to the development of classwork and assignments. All work should be your own.

- Plagiarism is unacceptable and will result in an immediate failure of the course. If you did not write the words, they do not belong in your paper. You cannot COPY AND PASTE anything from a book, the internet or any other source and put it in your paper.
- Do NOT include direct quotes unless the quote is cited properly and gives the author credit. Describe the material in your own words. Do not use words you do not understand.
