<u>Mission Statement</u> To empower and equip leaders to be sent and positioned for ministry in the inner cities around the world for the cause of the gospel.

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course focuses on taking students to the streets of the inner city. Engaging them directly with non-believers, in an effort to reconcile the lost back to Christ and disciple them to follow Him. This is a foundational practice of the Way World Outreach and will equip students, once adopt-ablock certified, on how to launch a church utilizing this key methodology.

# COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course:

- 1. Students will understand how to launch a church from ground zero in any city using the Adopt—A-Block method.
- 2. Students will grow in knowledge of inner-city ministry planning and the development of outreach strategies.
- 3. Students will learn how to evangelize the lost outside of the church.
- 4. Students will develop interpersonal skills in order to connect people into the church community.
- 5. Students will become soul winners that build churches!

#### **Portal Access and Usage**

#### Attendance

Grades cannot be given to assignments that are not turned in through the portal.
