An inductive study is seeking to supply strong evidence for the truth of the conclusion. Select any scripture from today's lesson and follow all the steps listed in this worksheet.

I. OBSERVATION

Chosen Scripture: James 1:17 NLT

Author: James the brother of Jesus (James the Just)

Audience: Jewish Christains (the twelve tribes)

What is happening: The gifts God gives us are never changing because God doesn't

change, He is the same today, yesterday, and forever.

Where is this happening: Outside Israel

When is this happening: Sometime before AD 69 and AD 62

Why is this happening: To educate the people that every good thing is from God and

that will never change.

How is this happening: James is preaching

What does the passage say? (Make lists, identify: contrasts, promises, & commands)

General Observations/Significance

- Contrast: God and His gift(s) will never change
- **Promise:** Every *perfect* gift comes from Heaven
- **Commands:** The "shadow of variation" will not become even to the slightest degree different.

Ask lots of questions of the passage

Questions/Findings

- How do we lose a gift(s) from God? We lose gift(s) from God by not stewarding what he has given us and acting in rebellion.
- How to gain more gift(s) from God: We can gain more gift(s) by obeying God.

Don not waver, for a person with divided loyalty is a unsettled as a was of the sea that is blown and tossed by the wind." I loved this part about how we go into his presence. But if what you ask for will further the kingdom of God such as asking for wisdom then we must expect to gain not the wisdom of man but of God with ultimate pure motives that will be used. We cannot be divided in our heart, longing for heavenly council but maybe also taking part in sin or desiring earthly treasures. We must come with true clean intentions when unto the Father.
